Writing

This summer, students will create any type of journal that they would like. Whether it is a classic marble notebook, a folder with their entries in the pockets, or even a collection of their writings simply stapled together, we just want our students writing! For students entering Grade 4, please complete at least **4 journal entries**. Here are some ideas but feel free to use your own ideas too.

Journal ideas:

- Tell the reader about how to complete a task of your choosing. Be sure to include transition words.
- Write a narrative (story) about an event that has happened in your life. Think about how you felt and make the reader feel like they were a part of the event.
- Write a piece of fiction. Make up a creative story that includes a clear plot (characters, setting, the main problem, climax, and resolution). Use your internal thoughts.
- Create a story using descriptive writing. Try to show the reader what happened rather than simply telling them.
- Write a persuasive piece. Use your writing to convince the audience about your point of view about any topic you would like. This should be written from the first-person point of view.
- Write an informational piece of writing. Research a topic that interests you. Teach the reader about your passion.
- Remember COPS: Capitalization, Organization, Punctuation, Spelling.




Summer Learning 2021 Students Entering Grade 4 Math
